








Register for at least one of the spring SAT or ACT administrations online (collegeboard.org or act.org)

Keep free or reduced lunch status updated to qualify for test and application fee waivers.

Enroll in a preparation program if possible (C2 Education, Kaplan, Princeton Review, Huntington, Khan Academy, tutor)



To be done with school counselor:

 Review transcript and check credits for graduation requirements (January - March)

 Choose grade 12 courses related to major of choice (remind students that GPA is cumulative of their freshman, sophomore and junior years)

Junior Year Checklist - College Preparation

- Decide what you want in terms of...small/big, dorm/commute, city/rural, distance from home search using *Naviance, College Board, College Scorecard, etc.*
- Research the majors/programs offered at the colleges you are interested in.
- Add schools to the "Colleges I'm Thinking About" list.
- Complete the pre-college survey & utilize the Naviance resume feature.



- Ask two teachers for recommendation letters by June.
- Look for internships and summer leadership programs related to your anticipated field.
- Athletes should register on NCAA Clearinghouse.

Junior Year Checklist - Summer into Senior Year

- Create a Common Application account
- Review writing prompts and start essay
- Move colleges to the "Applying to List"
- Decide as a family if applying EA or ED
- Finalize your college list
- Continue to prepare for SAT/ACT if testing again in fall
